AND HIS “EXPLORATION OF NONVIOLENCE,” WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 29, 2012**

Salt Lake City – The Salt Lake Interfaith Roundtable welcomes Arun Gandhi, grandson of legendary peacemaker and spiritual leader, Mohandas K. Gandhi (also known as Mahatma Gandhi), Wednesday, February 29, for jointly sponsored Interfaith Month lectures at Salt Lake Community College (SLCC) and the Salt Lake City Public Library Main Branch.

Mr. Gandhi will discuss the belief of Nonviolence and how it relates to the greater interfaith dialogue.

His interfaith work includes economic and social reform projects in India, as well as the United States. Together, he and his late wife Sunanda founded the M.K. Gandhi Institute for Nonviolence. Its mission is to educate and advance the practices of nonviolence in order to achieve a sustainable and just world.

Mr. Gandhi has traveled to Brazil, Nicaragua, Croatia, France, Ireland, and the United Kingdom to share his perspective on one of history’s most influential leaders.

Both lectures are free of charge and open to the public.
