Performers include a Christian gospel choir, Earth-based music, Hindu dance, Jewish music, readings from the Koran, LDS Children’s Choir, Little Taiko Buddhist Drums, Bell Ringers, a Sikh blessing, Tahiti Buddhist Dancing, dancers from Togo, Unitarian Choir, and more.
