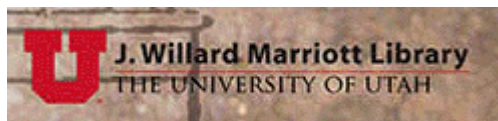
**“BUILDING BRIDGES AMONG FAITH TRADITIONS – MAKING SENSE OF SANDY:
