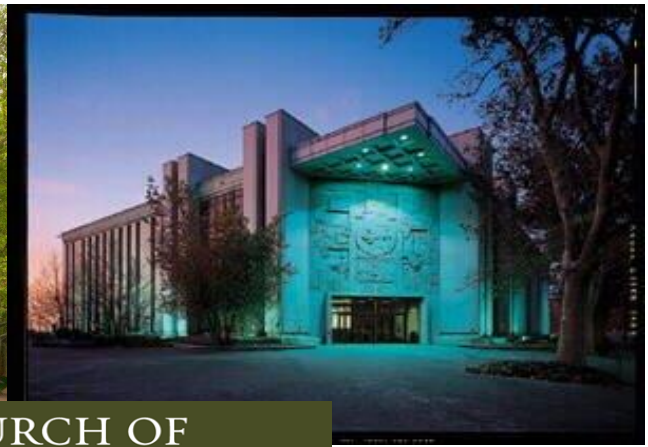

Tour of LDS Church History Museum

Closed for the last year, the newly renovated LDS Church History Museum was recently opened again to the public.

The LDS Church History Museum provides videos, informational displays, and historical artifacts, to tell the story of the early LDS Church history from 1820 to 1846.

This will be a **special guided tour for the Interfaith Season**, by the staff of the LDS Church History Museum. Refreshments will be served to participants at the end of the 1 hour tour.

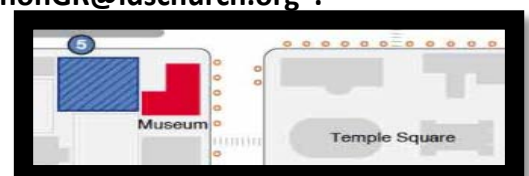

Reservations are recommended (first come, first served basis), as the tour size is limited.

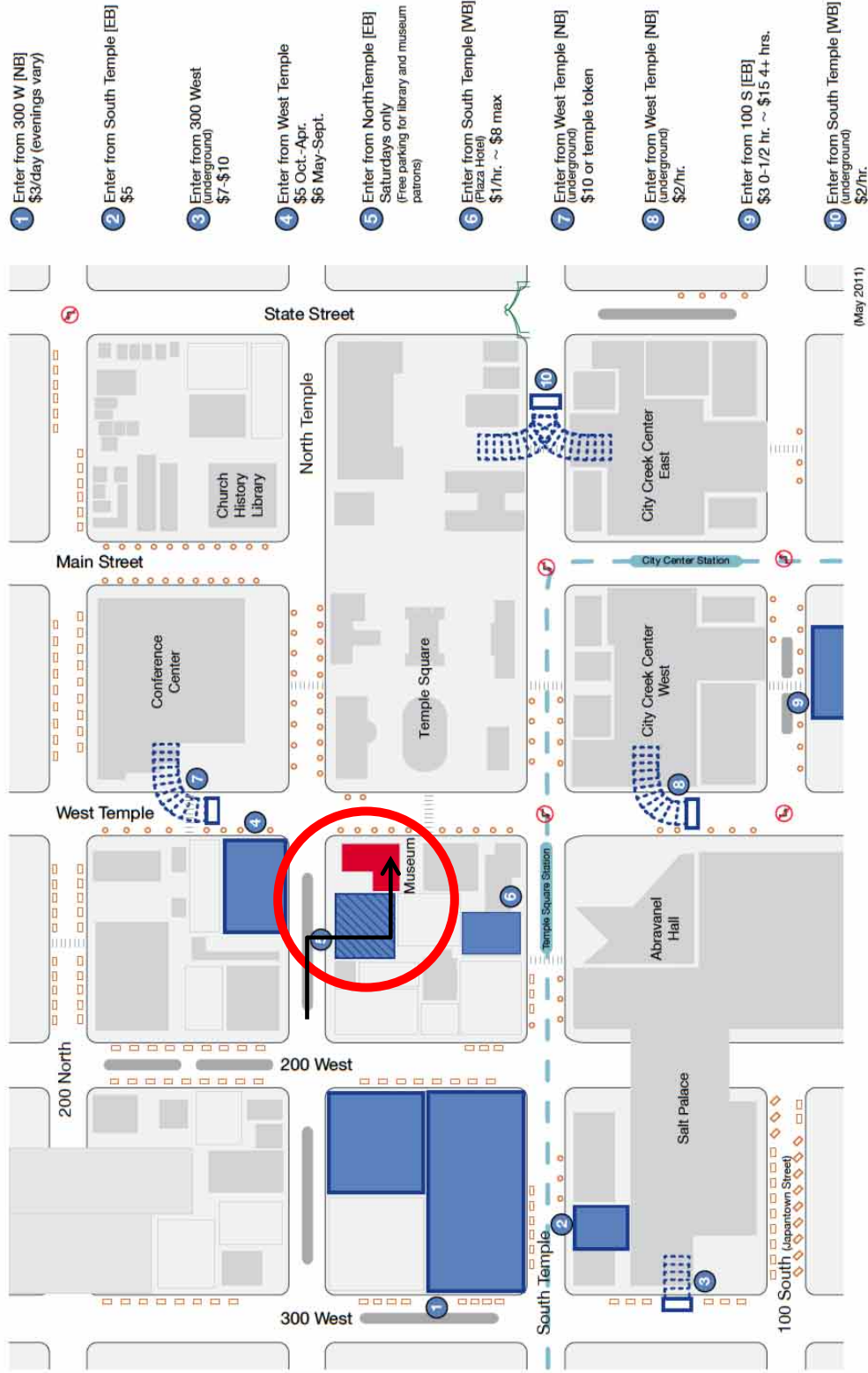

The LDS Church History Museum is located at 45 No. West Temple (SLC, UT 84150), directly across from the LDS Tabernacle, and next to the Family History Museum.

Free parking is available northeast of the Utah State Capitol building. (Continue north on State Street.) Patrons can take Bus 500 from the capitol to the library for free.

The nearest public lots are shown in blue. 2 hour street parking (□) and meters (○) are also available throughout the city. Metered parking is free after 6pm, for two hours on Saturdays, and all day Sundays and holidays.
